Introduction and background

It is important that we are smart and collaborative and that volunteers have the opportunity to make a contribution to our important projects, decision making and progress.

There may be occasions where a volunteer creates original items of work for us or make key decisions for the Charity.

As a volunteers for The Brain Tumour Charity, we ask you to agree that the original work and decision making that you do during your volunteering belongs to The Brain Tumour Charity.

Policy Details

The type of volunteering that may be affected by this agreement includes (but is not exhaustive):

- Photography
- Editorial pieces
- Blogging
- Design
- Coding

For those undertaking photography or videography work for The Charity, we ask that you:

- Read and are in agreement with any briefs supplied to you prior to the photoshoot.
- Ensure that The Charity is free to use the images you supply it without breaching copyright or any agreements you may have made with third parties.
- Ensure that when taking photos, privacy of the subjects is respected (e.g. if people aren't happy with their photo being taken).
- Obtain written permission from parents/guardians of any child not able to give consent being photographed where their faces are recognisable (we may do this for you – for example, if you are photographing an event of The Charity, are at a school event or other mass participation event like a marathon).
- Understand that once you have provided the images, The Charity will use them freely to promote its work.
- Do not provide any images taken on behalf of The Charity to third parties, or use them for any other purpose, unless expressly agreed by The Charity. As all image and publishing rights belong to the charity.
- Understand that although your activities will be covered by The Charities liability insurance, your equipment will not, and will remain your responsibility.
